Volunteers

- Be straight forward on what task you are asking of your volunteers. Divide the work up into smaller tasks, and have volunteers sign up for ones they like.

Motivating Members:

Involving Parents:

- Make sure parents are well informed of the fundraiser. Mail letters, emails, phone calls, and inform parents in person.
- Remind them of the brief meeting you will have to better inform them of the fundraiser the child should be part of.
- Remind parents that successful fundraising keeps their cost down, and allows your organization to continue to provide fun and exciting experiences for their children.

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
